Welcoming Guests is Gospel Work

As the Connections Coordinator for St. Paul’s, I am passionate that guests who worship with us for the first time feel loved and welcomed. Why? Because it is no less than Gospel work. How we receive new people on Sunday mornings can have eternal consequences. Will the guests who visit be warmly received and want to return to learn more about the salvation of God through Jesus? We’d also like to expand the Inside Welcome Teams to greet people before, during and after the services. And eventually we’d like to add Parking Lot Attendants to help folks navigate our campus.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul’s! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul’s we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings; therefore, children in third grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not comfortable with this, please know that we understand. We recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We’re here to help, so don’t hesitate to ask a priest about successful family worship.
- **Kids Church** (ages 3 –7) Sign-in for Kid’s Church will be in St. Paul’s Central of Doar Hall. Sign them in before service starts with Mrs. Shannon or the volunteer. Children will remain in the worship service until after the collect. After the collect, we invite your children to meet Mrs. Shannon at the front of the church. Mrs. Shannon will take the children to Kid’s church. The children will be escorted to St. Paul's Central during the offertory. At that time, parents please come to the doors and show your security tag to pick your child up. Children will be seated in their age groups for convenience.

Once your child enters the Children's Worship Center for Children's Church they will enjoy a time of chapel, as well as, a craft and activity that tie into the Bible lesson for the day. Please join our FaceBook page (*St. Paul's Summerville Children's & Faith at Home Ministry*) to see a recap of our morning in Children's church.

- ✚ **Child Check-In—(Birth to Seven Years**, for both the Church Building and Doar Hall) Check-in at the C/Y building or Doar Hall. A volunteer will walk them over to the C/Y Building and a volunteer will bring them back to pick up at the Offertory. Nursery check-in will remain in the C/Y Building at the nursery. You may pick your child up at the end of the sermon, or the end of the service.
- ✚ **Child Pick-up—**Please come to the back door of St. Paul's Central (Doar Hall where you checked in) and present your matching security tag to Mrs. Shannon or a volunteer to pick up your child.

Communion—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul’s. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.

All guests are invited to visit our **Welcome Table** after the service today to receive a gift and information about St. Paul’s.

Giving—Cash and checks may be placed in the offering plates. We have electronic giving centers in Doar Hall for debit and credit cards. St. Paul’s does not want anyone to incur debt in order to give to the Lord. We offer the electronic giving centers as a convenience.
