"One day a parent came up to me after a meeting and thanked me for teaching her daughter. I responded, as I usually do, that it was an honor to teach at RFIS and have such great students. She stopped me and said, "No, you do not understand. You, you individually, are the answer to my prayers." I was a little stunned and didn't know what to say, but she continued. "I have prayed for many years that my kids would get a good education even though we had to be in the village. When we began thinking about sending our daughter to RFIS, I prayed that someone would be able to teach her to play the flute (which I had started) and get her to love being fit. You were the answer to both of those prayers. God sent you here to meet my child's need so I could keep working on translation."

This is the story that I received a few weeks ago from the headmistress at RFIS. GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING

Welcome to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

• **Worship as a Family (all ages):** At St. Paul's we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings; therefore, children in third grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service. If you or your children are not comfortable with this, please know that we understand. We recognize that it might take time to develop the routine. We're here to help, so don't hesitate to ask a priest about successful family worship.

• **Kids Church (ages 3 –7)** Sign-in for Kid's Church will be in St. Paul's Central of Doar Hall. Sign them in before service starts with Mrs. Shannon or the volunteer. Children will remain in the worship service until after the collect. After the collect, we invite your children to meet Mrs. Shannon at the front of the church. Mrs. Shannon will take the children to Kid's church. The children will be escorted to St. Paul's Central during the offertory. At that time, parents please come to the doors and show your security tag to pick your child up. Children will be seated in their age groups for convenience.

Once your child enters the Children's Worship Center for Children's Church they will enjoy a time of chapel, as well as, a craft and activity that tie into the Bible lesson for the day. ✠ **Child Check-In—(Birth to Seven Years,** for both the Church Building and Doar Hall) Check-in at the C/Y building or Doar Hall. A volunteer will walk them over to the C/Y Building and a volunteer will bring them back to pick up at the Offertory. Nursery check-in will remain in the C/Y Building at the nursery. You may pick your child up at the end of the sermon, or the end of the service.

✠ **Child Pick-up—**Please come to the back door of St. Paul's Central (Doar Hall where you checked in) and present your matching security tag to Mrs. Shannon or a volunteer to pick up your child.

Communion—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion at St. Paul's. **Please note:** The Communion elements consist of real wine and bread or wafers containing wheat. Please ask the bread server for gluten free wafers. Receiving one or the other of the elements is considered participating as fully in the Eucharist as anyone who receives both.
