JESUS + NICHOLAS + SANTA CLAUS

The true focus and meaning of Christmas is the celebration of the birth of Jesus into the world to save sinners. Without Jesus, the Christ, being the center of our celebration—there is no Christmas. That celebration of Jesus is best experienced by gathering in church to hear, again, the ancient story of Jesus' birth. This story is told through Word, Hymns, and Prayers (of gratitude for God's faithfulness); thus, we receive the Word of God made Flesh in the Eucharist.

In the fourth century (after the Roman Empire ended it's persecution of the Christian Church), a saintly Bishop [from present day Turkey named Nicholas]

carried the Christmas Celebration into the secular world by giving gifts of food and financial support to poor families. He encouraged his church members to do the same. That gesture of compassion and love spread like wild fire across the world and down through the centuries. It took on special traditions and observances as it spread from country to country.

In America, after the industrial revolution, secular forces began to play down the religious significance of Christmas (transforming it into a business enterprise for enriching merchants). Instead of GIVING to others, the focus shifted to GETTING for self.

Once the merchandisers of Madison Avenue realized the business value of Christmas, they quickly dropped the religious references to "Christ" and "Saint Nicholas." They modified the image of a Bishop and his Miter into a "jolly old elf" wearing a scarlet stocking cap.

St. Nicholas, through it's Germanic moniker of "SinterKlaas," soon became known as "Santa Claus."

Because of the lack of resistance on the part of Christians, we have slowly allowed the religious significance of Christmas to be lost in today's world, for which Jesus died. Don't you think it is high time for us to take back Christmas and celebrate it as the birth of our Savior? You may not be able to make abrupt changes in the secular world, but you do have the power to change the way you celebrate it in your HOME.

**GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THIS MORNING** 

Welcome to St. Paul's! We hope to create an atmosphere in which everyone feels welcomed with open arms. Here is the information that you need to know for a successful morning of worship and Sunday School:

- Worship as a Family (all ages): At St. Paul's we encourage families to worship together on Sunday mornings; therefore, children in third grade and older will remain with their parents throughout the service.
