

Few of us live and work as farmers, directly dependent on the land. Some of the imagery familiar to our ancestors is foreign to us now. Yet, in those images are lessons for us in today's hightechnology world.



From the

very moment of creation, mankind's destiny is to develop and care for the world around us. God's first commandments to man were to be fruitful, and to take dominion over the created world. Genesis 2:15 tells us that God placed man in the garden to cultivate and keep it.

When we cultivate a garden, we do not cause the plants to grow but create conditions that favor their flourishing. Healthy growing plants need sunlight, water, nutrients in the soil, and protection from invading insects. The careful gardener examines the plants to see which need special care. Plants are pruned to avoid wasting resources in non-productive growth, and the seeds from good harvests are re-invested in the next year's growth. While most of us now live and work removed from the land, we are still expected to cultivate and keep those areas of our life that we inhabit. One of those areas is our communal life as a church body. We, at St. Paul's are to be rooted in the word and faith, sowing the seeds of the gospel for the future, cultivating our ministries and those who serve in them, and growing into our surrounding community.

While in Children's Church, your children learn: about bowing when the cross passes and why, as Anglicans, that we do this, who the acolytes are and how the colors of the stoles match the liturgical calendar, prayers, etc. Now is a great time to show them what we are learning in Children's Church.
- Sing the songs and pray. Children learn behavior by mimicking you.
- If you have to leave the worship with your child—please feel free to do so, but please do come back.
