



Our worship is similar to that of Anglicans across the world and through the ages. We are a warm and loving congregation. We enjoy traditional hymns as well as modern worship songs produced by popular Christian artists. Worship that is biblical and draws hearts to the praise, honor, and glory of our Lord is the goal at all of our services.

Our traditional worship with hymns is held in the historic Church Building. The contemporary worship, with a user-friendly screen and modern music, is in Doar Hall. We invite you to join us. All baptized Christians are welcome to join us for Holy Communion at the Lord's table.

COMMUNION—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion.

Wow! I'd say it's good to be back here for the season but it seems guite too simple for how I truly feel. It's wonderful to be back and to celebrate the feast of our Lord with you!

Thank you for all of the prayers and emails that you have been sending me for the past year! I must confess, it was quite difficult coming back and realizing how much this time has changed me. God has done a lot of work in my life. I think when we set out to do any kind of ministerial work we often think that we are on a mission to do great works for the kingdom. And then half of what we get out of it is all the work that God does in our lives. We may not even see the fruit of our labor, (this is quite hard to accept!), but we see how God has worked in our hearts and changed us, making us more like Him. No matter what happens, I think seeing God's work in our hearts is worth the pain and struggles we often face in our walk with him. This is not to say that our work is in vain or that God is not using us, but I do think we often see more of how God is changing us through our commitment to Him, then how He is changing the people we minister to.
