About Jeannie Scott Smith

Jeannie Scott Smith is an author and speaker who influences others based on her own life experiences and walk with God. She is committed to ministering to women across the world. Her love and passion for God show that her energy and efficiency is boundless. Jeannie lives a life of obedience to God. It's her belief that this is the only way to live a life of freedom and purpose. She inspires others to do the same. She speaks with passion and authority to groups of women on the serious and controversial issue of abortion, brokenness and the redemptive path to



healing. She is well known for her compassionate heart as a pregnancy center counselor for women facing unplanned pregnancies, and for women who have suffered the tragedy of abortion. However, the road to her current position of ministry was not easy or without its struggles. She is the author of *Shattered into Beautiful: Delivering the Brokenhearted from Abortion*. In this book, Jeannie shares her own personal testimony.

Jeannie is like one of the many faces you would encounter in your church that conceals a dreadful secret from her past. She came to realize that only Jesus could pay the price for the consequences of her abortion. She cried out to God to take this: her biggest failure, and turn it into a powerful witness that would touch the hearts of women struggling with these issues.

In 2010, God instructed Jeannie to write about her abortion experience. As much as she enjoyed her career as a Physical Therapist Assistant, she knew God had called her to full time ministry. Jeannie's response was obedience to God and He equipped her for that ministry. In the same year, her book Shattered into Beautiful... was accomplished and she received her Certificate from Abortion Recovery Training Institute. God then called her out of her comfort zone to give her testimony at events such as Silent No More and 40 Days of Life, as well as, at churches, youth conferences, and pregnancy center events. Jeannie still found her greatest joy was in working with women on an individual basis.

WORSHIP AT ST. PAUL'S ANGLICAN

Worship that is biblical and draws hearts to the praise, honor, and glory of our Lord is the goal at all of our services.

Our traditional worship with hymns is held in the historic Church Building. The contemporary worship, with a user-friendly screen and modern music, is in Doar Hall. We invite you to join us. All baptized Christians are welcome to join us for Holy Communion at the Lord's table.

COMMUNION—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion.

TO PARENTS OF YOUNG CHILDREN - Relax! God put the wiggles and sweet little noises in children - don't feel like you have to suppress them in God's house.

- Consider sitting toward the front where children can more easily engage.
- Quietly explain the parts of the service and actions of the priests, musicians, acolytes, and leaders. While in Children's Church, your children learn: about bowing when the cross passes and why, as Anglicans, that we do this, who the acolytes are and how the colors of the stoles match the liturgical calendar, prayers, etc. Now is a great time to show them what we are learning in Children's Church.
- Sing the songs and pray. Children learn behavior by mimicking you.
- If you have to leave the worship with your child—please feel free to do so, but please do come back.

Jeannie is the founder and CEO of the Coastline Women's Center, a Pregnancy Medical Clinic in S.C

(www.coastlinewomenscenter.org) serving several locations. Her husband Carter, is co-founder and he brings his own perspective to men as they work with individuals and couples. Together they are committed to transform "at risk" families into thriving families. Today, Jeannie is continuing to follow where the Lord leads. She is now the President of the South Carolina Association of Pregnancy Care Centers.

Jeannie's spiritual gifts are Pastoring, Mercy, Exhortation, and Leadership. She states her greatest teacher is Jesus. Her mission is to bring abortion to an end and to bring the brokenhearted to the feet of Jesus. Through this process, the wounded can be restored, healed and God will be glorified.

Jeannie sees how her love relationship with Jesus Christ flowed over into daily obedience, and how that obedience unleashed supernatural blessings and accomplishments. Her passion is to awaken others to this truth. Hence, in 2017 her second book, *If You Love Me Obey Me: The Secret to Purpose and Freedom* was published.
