



# What is it? Why Should I attend? — Fr. J. Tripp Jeffords

Way back when, old school Episcopalians had an ANNUAL PARISH meeting. Sometimes, folks would attend in order to make a political push for vestry candidates who might best represent their personal interests

within the parish. Votes were taken, feelings were often hurt, and it looked nothing like the ways in which they did business in the early church. There would be long committee reports taken



from meeting minutes during the previous year (boring)! A budget for the coming year would be presented. Often times, that budget would be scrutinized and criticized by parishioners who wanted, once again, to put their personal interests first. There must be a better way!

There is a better way, indeed! And that way is to direct our attention more toward building the Kingdom, ministry wins over the past year, inspiring stories of Christian ministry, and a retelling of what God is doing among us - OUR VISION.

This year's Vision Sunday (annual parish meeting) will be held TODAY, Sunday, January 19, immediately following our church services at 10:15. You are all warmly invited and encouraged to attend!

Why is it necessary? Well, because people forget. Unless a community of believers keeps holding up God's vision amongst His people, they will forget God's direction for their lives. Exodus 1:8 speaks about the 400 years of slavery for the Hebrews under Pharaoh. Yes, the text says, "Now there arose a new king over Egypt, who did not know Joseph." However, it is also true that the Hebrews had forgotten God in those 400 years. The next 40 years of wandering would be like a renewed courtship between God and His people as they had to relearn the ways of God.

#### **WORSHIP AT ST. PAUL'S ANGLICAN**

**ST. PAUL'S VISION STATEMENT**—*Rooted* in the past yet relevant today: St Paul's *sows* the Good News of Jesus for all people, *cultivates* servant leaders, and *grows* neighborly communities.

Our worship is similar to that of Anglicans across the world and through the ages. We are a warm and loving congregation. We enjoy traditional hymns as well as modern worship songs produced by popular Christian artists. Worship that is biblical and draws hearts to the praise, honor, and glory of our Lord, is the goal at all of our services.

Our traditional worship with hymns is held in the historic Church Building. The contemporary worship, with a user-friendly screen and modern music, is in Doar Hall. We invite you to join us. All baptized Christians are welcome to join us for Holy Communion at the Lord's table.

**COMMUNION**—Anyone baptized in the Christian faith is welcome to receive communion.

**DOAR HALL COMMUNION**—Communion wafers will be dispensed at the side aisle communion stations. Leavened bread is available at the altar. Feel free to choose either element/station.

**TO PARENTS OF YOUNG CHILDREN** - Relax! God put the wiggles and sweet little noises in children - don't feel like you have to suppress them in God's house.

- Consider sitting toward the front where children can more easily engage.
- Quietly explain the parts of the service and actions of the priests, musicians, acolytes, and leaders. While in Children's Church, your children learn: about bowing when the cross passes and why, as Anglicans, that we do this, who the acolytes are, and how the colors of the stoles match the liturgical calendar, prayers, etc. Now is a great time to show them what we are learning in Children's Church.
- Sing the songs and pray. Children learn behavior by mimicking you.
- If you have to leave the worship with your child—please feel free to do so, but please do come back.

#### **NURSERY AND CHILDREN'S CHURCH**

Childcare is available for ages birth through 3 years of age. You will find a greeter there to assist you with check-in. We ask that you please check your child in at one of our check-in kiosks located in Doar Hall and in the CY building. At that point you will receive a matching security tag that will need to be shown when you pick up your child.

Children's Church is provided for children ages 3-7. Please follow the check-in instructions above. The children will be dismissed for chapel during the 10:15 service. While there, your child will enjoy a time of chapel, a bible lesson that follows the lectionary, learning of our Anglican traditions, and crafts and games.
