SERGE MISSIONS - MEREDITH WELSH

Meredith Welsh grew up with us at St. Paul's. She is one of Christ's own, a Clemson student in the class of '21 who is pursuing a B.S. in Marketing. She is also an Honors student in the select Calhoun Honors College.

I hope your time in 2020 has started off well! For the past couple of months, I have been in a season of preparation. I am reaching out to share with you how God has given me the opportunity to travel to London, England, as a summer intern with Serge (an international mission organization see: Serge.org).

I am eager and thankful to participate in and experience God's work across the world in a cross-cultural setting. London is a diverse city, and Serge has been active in London for more than 20 years through church-planting and sharing the gospel in culturally understandable ways. I am deeply interested in other cultures and in building relationships with people that are different from myself. It will be an exciting experience for me! I am not sure how God will use me this summer, but I am coming with open hands to receive God's goodness and to love those around me through Him.

I will be serving with the long-term teams as they immerse themselves in local cultures through partnering with and serving local churches. They then can disciple a group of Jesus-followers in their cultural context. The teams plant churches in culturally and economically diverse areas and provide outreach services such as a homeless ministries, children's ministries, and mercy ministries. Depending on the community, I would be serving in street outreach, communitybased youth work, working in local thrift stores, visiting local families, taking part in a discipleship program and bible study, and sharing the love of Jesus Christ.

In order to make this trip successful, I need support - both spiritually and financially. I ask that you pray for me while I am in London. Pray that I would humble myself and seek the Lord, so that I can be obedient to where He wants me to be. I also ask that you pray for the team in London. Please pray that the suffering and joys experienced in London would remind us of our hope in Christ and that He will restore all things.

I will need financial support to make this trip possible. The cost of the trip is \$5,700, and it will cover airfare to and from the field, food and lodging, all onfield expenses, and any necessary ministry expenses. WORSHIP AT ST. PAUL'S ANGLICAN
